Loading Equipment on Trailers



When loading equipment onto trailers, always remember:

1. Inspect Equipment and Trailer:

- a. Ensure both the equipment and trailer are in good working condition.
- b. Check for any visible damage or wear that could compromise safety.

2. Use Proper Loading Techniques:

- a. Use proper ramps or loading docks for the size/type of equipment.
- b. Securely fasten ramps to prevent slipping or shifting during loading.
