

RISK REMINDER

Tree/Brush Cutting Safety

Following the checklist below can help reduce claims and provide a safe environment when cutting trees and brush.

Proper Equipment:

Always use appropriate safety gear, including gloves,

safety glasses, sturdy footwear, and high-viability clothing.

Tool Safety:

Ensure all cutting tools are sharp and in good working

condition. Dull tools can lead to accidents.

Traffic Awareness:

Be aware of oncoming traffic. Use traffic cones or

warning signs to alert drivers of your presence.

Safe Lifting:

Use proper lifting techniques when picking up brush.

Bend at the knees, not waist, to prevent back injuries.

Debris Management: Keep the work area clear of debris to prevent tripping

hazards.

Weather Conditions: Be mindful of weather conditions. Wet or windy

weather can make this work more dangerous.

Team Communication: If working in a team, maintain clear communication to

ensure everyone's safety.

Emergency Plan: Have an emergency plan in place, including knowledge

of the nearest hospital and a stocked first aid kit.
